We'd meet again—same joy, same time.

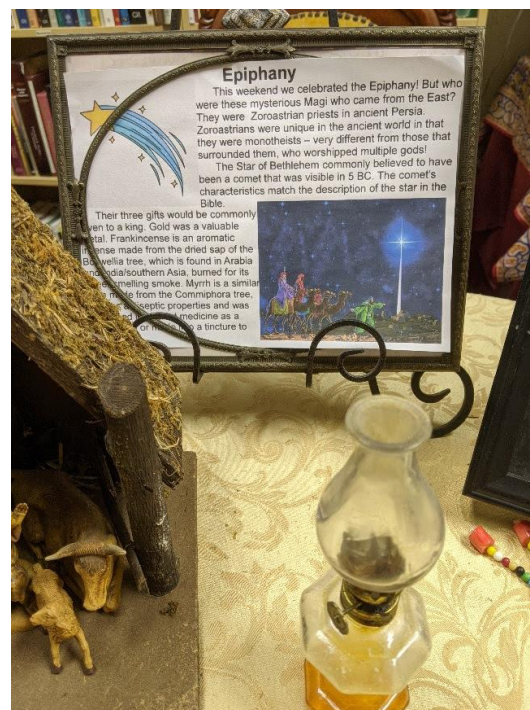
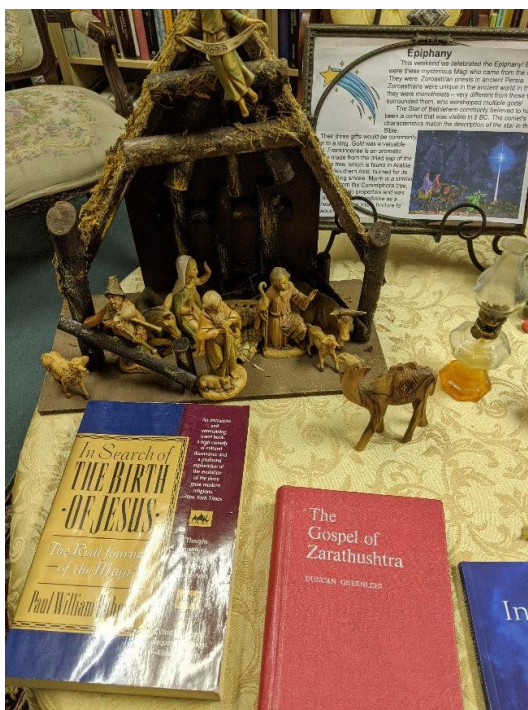

Holy Days Table Monthly Decorations

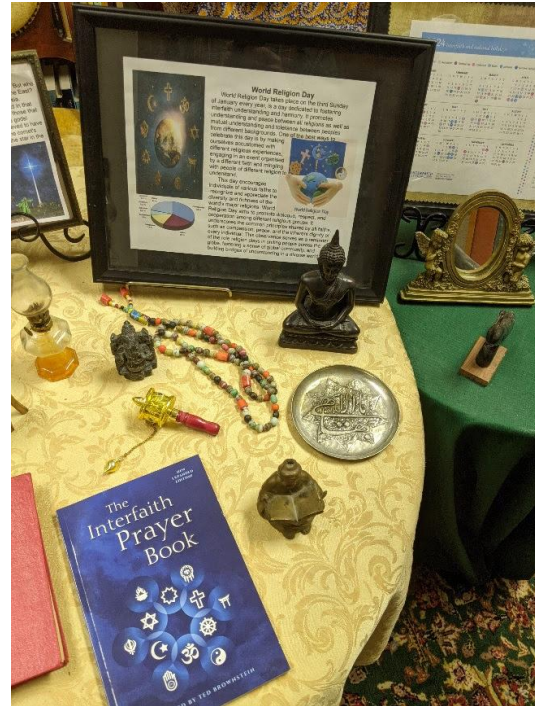
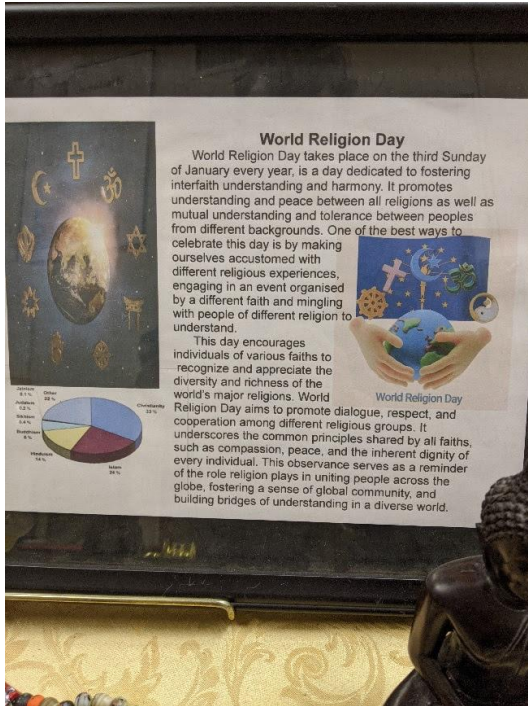


This month we celebrated Epiphany, when Zoroastrian Priests found Baby Christ, and are looking forward to this month's World Religions Day. Celebrated on the third Sunday in January, 18th, this holy day promotes interfaith understanding, tolerance, and peace by highlighting the common principles of the world's religions.



World's Religion Day is an observance that was initiated in 1950 by the National Spiritual Assembly of the Bahá'ís of the

United States, which is celebrated worldwide on the third Sunday in January each year. People celebrate by attending interfaith events, learning about other traditions, and engaging in community discussions about shared spiritual values, that all faiths contribute to humanity's spiritual journey.



Weekly Object:

'The Ball' New York, New York



This year NYC had a new design of 'The Ball,' nicknamed 'Constellation Ball,' the ninth and largest version yet featuring over 5,000 circular Waterford

crystals and advanced LED lighting to create intricate patterns and colors, symbolizing hope and interconnectedness, and it will also drop for America's 250th birthday on July 4th



The New Year's Eve ball in New York City began in 1907 at Times Square, introduced by The New York Times to mark the opening of its new headquarters and to replace fireworks banned by the city. The first ball was made of iron and wood, lit with 100 light bulbs, and weighed about 700 pounds.



Over the past 118 years, the ball has evolved from a simple illuminated sphere into a technologically advanced crystal and LED display, reflecting changes in engineering, media, and design. Its purpose has remained constant: to provide a shared public ritual of timekeeping, renewal, and collective celebration as the new year begins.
