## Weekly Object: Our Traffic Lamp (Black History Month)

---

The story of the light bulb starts with a bunch of tinkerers in the 1800s trying to trap lightning in a glass jar, until Thomas Edison finally cooked up a practical, long-lasting bulb in the late 1870s and 1880s.



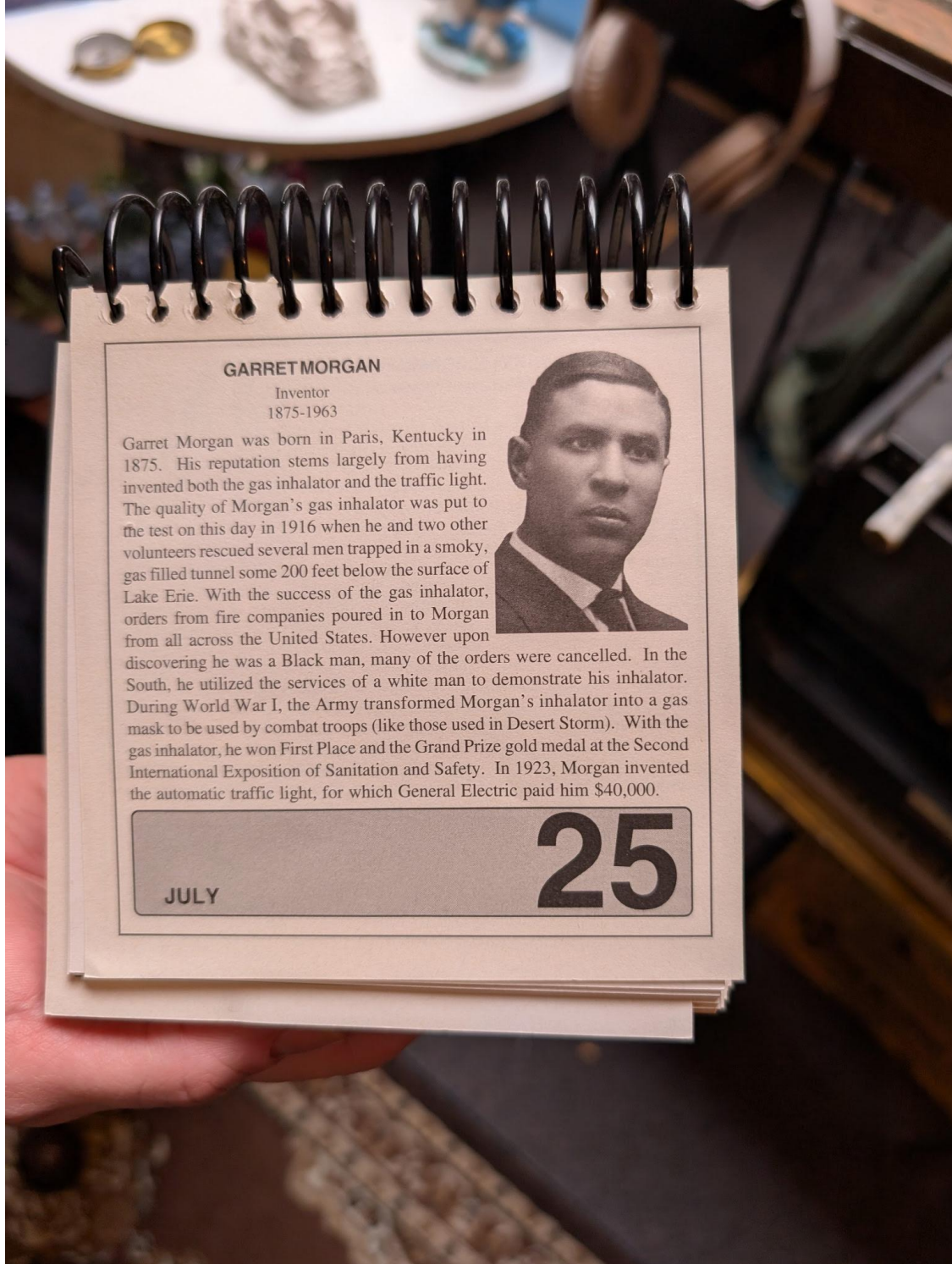
Enter **Lewis Latimer**, the brilliant Black inventor who upgraded Edison's bulb with a tougher, longer-lasting carbon filament, helping electric light move from fancy labs into everyday homes.



Then, fast-forward to city streets, where **Garrett Morgan** saw traffic chaos and invented a three-position traffic signal in 1923, giving us the “caution” stage that would become the yellow light we all know.



Between Latimer's glowing filaments and Morgan's bright-idea traffic signals, Black inventors literally helped turn on the lights—and keep us safe—on the way to the modern world.
